### **Legislation Updates:**

Petrol Vapour Recovery Pollution Prevention and Control (Industrial Emissions) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2016



These Regulations have been made by the Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs. They make an amendment to the PPC(IE) Regulations (NI)2013 to take account of EU Directive 2014/99/EU, which sets two new standards for equipment used for Stage II petrol vapour recovery.

The first standard specifies the test methods for the approval of petrol vapour recovery systems for use in refuelling vehicles at service stations. The second standard states the test methods to be used at service stations to verify the effective operation of such vapour recovery systems. Service stations and manufacturers of equipment for petrol vapour recovery will be legally required to comply with these new standards on vapour recovery. The Regulations come into operation on 22 August 2016.

### Packaging Waste Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2016

The Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs has carried out a consultation regarding its intention to consolidate the Producer Responsibility Regulations (NI) 2007 and subsequent amending regulations.

The consolidation does not introduce any policy changes to the existing regime for packaging waste but aims to make the regulations more accessible by combining them into a single statutory rule. The draft regulations also include amendments to the plastic and glass packaging targets. The Department intends to make the consolidated regulations during the second half of 2016 with a view to them coming into operation before the end of 2016.

## COMMISSION IMPLEMENTING REGULATION (EU) 2016/1141 of 13 July 2016 adopting a list of invasive alien species of Union concern pursuant to Regulation (EU) No 1143/2014 of the European Parliament and of the Council

The European Commission has published Commission Implementing Regulation 2016/1141, which implements the first list of Invasive Alien Species of Union Concern, comprising 37 species (23 animals and 14 plants).

The list will come into force on 3 August 2016.

## The Renewables Obligation Closure (No.2) Order (Northern Ireland) 2016

This Statutory Rule will close the Northern Ireland Renewables Obligation (NIRO) to new small scale (i.e. up to 5 megawatts (MW) installed capacity) onshore wind generation and existing small scale generating stations adding additional capacity from 1 July 2016 and introduce exceptions to closure in the form of limited defined grace periods.

The Order came into force on 29 June 2016

## McIlveen announces opening of next phase of the Forest Expansion Scheme

Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs Minister Michelle McIlveen announced encouraging news for the forestry sector by opening the next phase of the Forest Expansion Scheme.

The scheme, under the Rural Development Programme, is part financed by the European Agricultural Fund for Rural Development and the Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs.

It will provide support for farmers and landowners to plant woodlands of five hectares or larger this coming winter. The first phase of the scheme last year resulted in over 180 hectares of new woodland planting.
