COMMISSION IMPLEMENTING REGULATION (EU) 2016/1141 of 13 July 2016 adopting a list of invasive alien species of Union concern pursuant to Regulation (EU) No 1143/2014 of the European



1143/2014 of the European Parliament and of the Council

The European Commission has published Commission Implementing Regulation 2016/1141, which implements the first list of Invasive Alien Species of Union Concern, comprising 37 species (23 animals and 14 plants).

The list will come into force on 3 August 2016.

The Renewables Obligation Closure (No.2) Order (Northern Ireland) 2016

This Statutory Rule will close the Northern Ireland Renewables Obligation (NIRO) to new small scale (i.e. up to 5 megawatts (MW) installed capacity) onshore wind generation and existing small scale generating stations adding additional capacity from 1 July 2016 and introduce exceptions to closure in the form of limited defined grace periods.

The Order came into force on 29 June 2016

Update:

McIlveen announces opening of next phase of the Forest Expansion Scheme

Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs Minister Michelle McIlveen announced encouraging news for the forestry sector by opening the next phase of the Forest Expansion Scheme.

The scheme, under the Rural Development Programme, is part financed by the European Agricultural Fund for Rural Development and the Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs.

It will provide support for farmers and landowners to plant woodlands of five hectares or larger this coming winter. The first phase of the scheme last year resulted in over 180 hectares of new woodland planting.

Legislation: Food Waste Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2015 -New Rules

A food business is any business that carries out activities related to the processing, distribution, preparation or sale of food. This includes:

- Restaurants and cafes
- Shopping and food courtsCanteens
- Canteer
 Hotels
- Dubs that serve fr
- Pubs that serve foodShops that serve food
- Supermarkets
- Schools and colleges
- Prisons, nursing homes and hospitals.

If you are a food business then you must be prepared to present food waste for separate collection:

- by 1 April 2016 for large producers (producers of more than 50kg of food waste per week)
- by 1 April 2017 for small producers (producers of between 5kg and 50kg of food waste per week) and Health and Social Care trusts.
