New Legislation



The Pesticides (Amendment) Regulations 2019

These Regulations update references to the Regulation (EC) No 1107/2009 which sets rules for the authorisation of plant protection products (often referred to as pesticides). The updates take account of the latest amendment to the EU Regulation, with the effect that products meeting the description of plant biostimulants will become subject to the rules for fertilisers rather than the rules for pesticides.

The Regulations come into force on 31 October 2019

The Environmental Impact Assessment (Transport) (Scotland) Regulations 2019

The Regulations provides technical updates to provisions of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984, the Transport and Works (Scotland) Act 2007 and the Transport and Works (Scotland) Act 2007 (Applications and Objections Procedure) Rules 2007. These are to ensure the Environmental Impact Assessment process for transport projects conforms with the requirements of Directive 2014/52/EU.

The Regulations come into force on 07 December 2019

Environment Bill

On the 15 October 2019 the Government introduced the Environment Bill to Parliament, to tackle the biggest environmental priorities of our time. While the Bill applies only to England, more than half of its measures – such as those designed to drive up recycling rates – are designed to apply across the UK, with the consent of the devolved administrations, helping the nation deal with the major environmental challenges together.

Key areas include:

- creating a new governance framework for the environment;
- a new independent public body – the Office of Environmental Protection
- setting legally binding environmental targets;
- a new direction for resources and waste management, moving towards a more circular economy, crackdown on litter and tackling waste crime;
- improving air quality;
- delivering sustainable water resources;
- restoring and enhancing nature and green spaces;
- updating laws on chemicals (REACH).

This consultation is focussed on the role of public sector bodies in ending Scotland's contribution to climate change, how the Public Sector Climate Change Reporting Duties should be revised to support that, and how Scottish Government and the wider public sector can work together to make a step-change in delivery.

We want to hear from public bodies, but we also want to hear from other organisations and individuals about what you think public sector bodies should be doing to tackle climate change.

The Deposit and Return Scheme for Scotland Regulations 2020: accompanying statement and proposed regulations

The Scottish Government recognises that fresh interventions are needed to bring about the systemic and behavioural change necessary to fulfil the aspiration of creating a more circular economy.

Scottish Ministers have announced legislation to establish a Deposit Return Scheme which would enable consumers to take single-use containers back and redeem a 20p deposit from any retailer selling drinks covered by the scheme, including plastic bottles made from PET plastic, aluminium and steel cans and glass bottles.

The Scottish Government have opened a Green Investment Programme aimed to help Scotland transition to a net-zero economy.

The Green Investment Portfolio will give local authorities, developers and third sector organisations the opportunity to pitch for large scale investment to support projects reducing Scotland's emissions in areas like renewables, waste, transport and the circular economy.

Businesses asked to help shape new UK electronic waste tracking service

The four UK governments and environment agencies are working together to develop an electronic waste tracking service that will capture information on all movements of waste in the UK.

The project is progressing well and in October 2019 two companies received [GovTech](#) funding of up to £500,000 each to develop a prototype waste tracking service over a 12 month period. You can read the latest information about the project [here](#).

As the project moves into this next phase the project partners are keen for businesses to help shape waste tracking to ensure that it meets their needs by joining a user panel which will provide the opportunity to take part in user research and test software as it is developed. The majority of user panel activity will take place online, via email or in the workplace and signing up does not commit businesses to anything.
