

# **New Legislation**



# Domestic Renewable Heat Incentive Scheme Regulations (Amendment) 2020

This instrument makes changes to the legislation concerning both the Non-Domestic and Domestic Renewable Heat Incentive schemes.

The Regulations extend the Domestic Renewable Heat Incentive (DRHI) Scheme for an additional year and introduce a 3<sup>rd</sup> flexible allocation of Tariff Guarantees on the Non-Domestic Renewable Heat Incentive Scheme. These proposals are designed to ensure a smooth transition between the Renewable Heat Incentive (RHI) and the future support mechanisms, outlined in the consultation: Future Support for Low Carbon Heat.

The Regulations also extend the commissioning deadline for projects currently holding a Tariff Guarantee, to grant these projects additional time to fully commission in light of delays caused by COVID-19.

The Regulations came into force on 20 July 2020

# Reforms to the tax treatment of red diesel and other rebated fuels

At Budget 2020, the government announced that it will remove the entitlement to use red diesel from April 2022, except in agriculture (as well as forestry, horticulture and fish farming), rail and for non-commercial heating (including domestic heating).

The consultation seeks views on whether the government has overlooked any exceptional reasons why other sectors should be allowed to continue to use red diesel beyond April 2022.

This consultation closes at 11:45pm on 1 October 2020.

# **Green Recovery - call for views**

A green, just and resilient recovery has been highlighted by Governments across the world, including the Scottish Government, as essential in effectively responding to the current challenges of the COVID-19 health crisis (including the social and economic challenges).

The Environment, Climate Change and Land Reform (ECCLR) Committee has agreed to launch an open Call for Views on green recovery, focusing on identifying the principles, opportunities, key actions for change, immediate priorities, leadership and governance needed to underpin an effective green recovery, as well as the potential barriers to implementation.

The call for views will be open until Friday 7 August 2020.

# Taking action to stay resilient - Advice and support for Scottish abstractors and irrigators

Water is a resource that underpins key industries like food and drink production and, despite Scotland's reputation for wet weather, water scarcity is becoming more common in Scotland with significant impacts on businesses. The Scottish Environment Protection Agency (SEPA) is offering support and guidance to those that regularly abstract water as part of their operations to help them manage their water use.

Being efficient in water use can save businesses money and increase resilience to the impacts of prolonged dry conditions. SEPA forecasts, monitors and reports on the availability of Scotland's water resources, publishing a weekly water scarcity situation report. The <u>weekly report</u> categorises the situation across Scotland and can help with decision making.

### Take action to use water wisely and increase business resilience:

- Plan ahead and know what actions you can take to minimise water use and protect water supplies in your catchment.
- Check the weekly situation report.
- When irrigating your land, check equipment isn't leaking, don't over spray, and use trickle irrigation.
- Follow conditions in your abstraction permit.

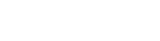
- Stagger abstractions with other operators, reduce the volume used, and irrigate at night where possible
- Switch to alternative supplies, like boreholes, or temporarily stop abstracting if you can.
- Get advice and support from SEPA.

### The Sustainable Innovation Fund: SBRI phase 1

Organisations can apply for a share of up to £10 million, including VAT, to help UK businesses and the public sector recover from COVID-19 in a sustainable manner.

The Innovate UK Small Business Research Initiative (SBRI) programme provides innovative solutions to challenges faced by the public sector. SBRI competitions are open to all organisations that can demonstrate a route to market for their solution. The SBRI scheme is particularly suited to small and medium-sized businesses. Developments are 100% funded and focused on specific identified needs, increasing the chance of exploitation.
