Scotland's Deposit Return Scheme







You are a retailer if you sell drinks:

- in your shop
- online
- in a bar, hotel, restaurant
- through a vending machine.

What you must do:

• You must have clear signs for customers saying that a 20p deposit will be charged.

- What containers
- PET Plastic, aluminium, steel, or glass
- that can contain 50ml to 3 litres of drinks.
- have been sold
 by you on or after
 16 August 2023
- If a retail outlet, then you must have clear signage stating that the deposit of 20p will be applied.
- If you are an online retailer, then your website must state that the 20p deposit applies.
- If you sell through a vending machine, then the information about the deposit must be visible on the vending machine.
- You must charge the deposit on every drink in a container you sell
 that is covered by the scheme. If you are in the hospitality sector, and
 the drinks will be consumed on the premises, you don't have to charge
 and return a deposit.
- You must operate a return point (unless exempt) where customers can return drinks containers covered by the scheme.
- You must pay back the 20p deposit on all containers returned that are part of the scheme. (Unless in the hospitality sector and drinks are consumed on the premises)
- You must store the empty containers for collection by the producer or scheme administrator acting on their behalf. They will pay you 20p for each container you return and a reasonable handling fee.
